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\* This agreement is available only for divorces involving modest assets and in which the parties agree to the terms of divorce without involving the attorney in dispute resolution. It includes conferences with the Client, preparation and delivery of all documents to the court and delivery of the final decree and documents to Client and Client's ex-spouse. In unusual situations the judge may request the parties appear for a hearing, attorney fees for preparation and attending such a hearing are charged separately. Generally, if the parties appear fair with each other in the documents, the judge does not request a hearing.

\*\* Occasionally parties wish to divide future payment rights to an existing ERISA retirement plan. In such cases a Domestic Retirement Order (QDRO) is required. The cost of any required QDRO order is in addition to all other fees provided herein. In no event will a QDRO be drafted without the Client's express agreement to the cost to be incurred.

\*\*\* Additional charges will be made for such things as multiple homes, investment properties to be divided, and other unusual complicating circumstances not normally encountered.
